Lineage.

The title of Baron and Magnat was conferred on this family by letters patent bearing the sign-manual of his Majesty LEOPOLD, Emperor of Germany, under the great seal of the kingdom of Hungary, given at Vienna, the 8th April, 1704, on Daniel-John de Hochedepied, and was confirmed to the late Baron and to his family, by royal licence, dated at Carlton House, London, 27 Sept. 1819.

This family, according to the aforesaid royal diploma, in which are cited certain documents dated in the year 1210, had been at that period long established in Belgium, and is supposed, by Jean le Carpenter, in his History, to have been a branch of the family of Boistrenecourt, in the Cambresis, where, in the year 1100, it had been much distinguished, and had attained to the highest and most conspicuous stations of dignity, civil as well as ecclesiastical.

NICHOLAS DE HOCHEDEPIED, in the year 1575, was appointed minister and ambassador from the states-general of Holland, to several electors and potentates in Germany.

DANIEL-JOHN DE HOCHEDEPIED, being minister from the states general of Holland at the Ottoman Porte in 1698, distinguished himself in the negotiations which terminated in the peace of Carlowitz, in Jan. 1699; and having likewise by his virtues and influence obtained the liberation of many Christian slaves from Turkish servitude, the Emperor LEOPOLD conferred upon him and his descendants, male and female, the title of Baron and Magnat. He m. Clarissa-Catherine, Countess Collyer, and was father of

ELBERT DE HOCHEDEPIED, ambassador from the states-general of Holland at the Ottoman Porte, b. 6 Jan. 1706, who d. at Pera, 11 Feb. 1763, leaving, by Anna-Margaretha Boelema, his wife, a dau., CLARA-CATHERINE, who m. Sir James Porter, British ambassador at Constantinople during the reigns of GEORGE II. and GEORGE III., and afterwards minister plenipotentiary at the Court of Brussels. Their only son and heir,

GEORGE, M.P. for Stockbridge for twenty-five years, lieut.-gen. in the army, and col. of the 103rd regt., assumed the name and title of (BARON) DE HOCHEDEPIED, under the royal letters patent, dated at Vienna, 8 April, 1704. The General dying issueless, the title was assumed by the late baron, JOHN-JAMES-LARPENT, under the above-recited letters patent and royal licence, as eldest son of Anna-Margaretha, the elder and only surviving sister, who left issue, of the said Lieut.-Gen. George, Baron de Hochedepied. (See LARPENT, Baronet.) The late Baron, John-James Larpent, was b. 13 May, 1783; he was British Consul at Antwerp from 1825 to 1839; he m. Georgiana, dau. of Frederick Reeves, Esq. of East Sheen, Surrey, and d. 8 June, 1860, having had issue,

Arms—A military shield, erect, per pale, divided perpendicularly into two equal parts. On the dexter side, on a field, arg., a chevron, acute angular, erect, gu., above which two crescents, and below one. On the sinister side, on a field, az., a right hand, the fingers and palm spread open; below, two fetters, with chains broken, ppr., as a true and faithful memorial of Christian charity, displayed by the liberation of many unhappy Christians lingering in Turkish servitude, and for services rendered in the negotiations which terminated in the peace of Carlowitz in Jan. 1699.

Crest—Two military helmets craticulated, or, open, with royal diadems; the one, with a crescent, sa., the other with a right hand, extended, ppr.

Motto—Optivo cognomine crescit.

Lineage.

This family, which had, previously to the cession of the island of Jamaica by Spain to England, in 1655, for many generations, held large possessions there, is of Spanish origin, and was of great rank and station in its original country. In 1610, we find one FRANCIS DE LOSADA, founding a commanderie of St. Stephan, and at a later period, the representative of the family, the celebrated DUQUE DE LOSADA, was Grand Chamberlain to CHARLES III., King of the two Sicilies, and was created by him, at his coronation as King of Spain, at Barcelona, 17 Oct. 1759,* a Grandee of the 1st class, the title of Duke in Spain being borne only by grandees. He d. s. p. and was s. in the family honours by his kinsman,

EMANUEL DE LOUSADA, Esq., who lived in great splendour on his West Indian estates. He was s. by his only surviving son,

ISAAC DE LOUSADA, Esq., whose right to the title of DUKE DE LOSADA Y LOUSADA, as borne by his ancestors, was confirmed as above. He m. his cousin, Lydia de Lousada, maternal granddaughter of the Baron d'Aguilar, by which lady (who d. in 1837) he left issue,

Lineage.

The MAGAWLYS, a family of great antiquity in Ireland claim descent from NIALL of the nine hostages; and were styled "Princes of Calry," in the co. of Westmeath. In 1631, the Emperor CHARLES VI. conferred upon Field-Marshal Philip-Henry Magawly, who m. Margaret d'Este, of Austria, the dignity of a Count of the Holy Roman Empire, and the rank and privileges of a grandee of Spain. The field-marshal, who was son of Henry Magawly, by his wife, Mary, dau. of John Browne, Esq. of The Neale, had one son, Henry, who d. young and unm., and a dau., the Donna Benedicta Magawly, lady of honour to the empress, and "dame de l'ordre de Marie Thérèse," who d. s. p. in 1799, whereupon the title reverted to his (the field-marshal's) grand-nephew,

PATICK-AWLY MAGAWLY, of Frankford, in the King's County, son of Frank Magawly, Esq. of Frankford, by Bridget his wife. He was in the early part of his life in the service of the Empress Queen MARIA-THERESA, and was employed to negotiate the marriage of one of the archduchesses (her dau.) with the Duke of Parma. He m. Jane, dau. of Christopher Fallon, Esq. of Runnymede, co. Roscommon, and d. 1800, having had,
